Your rights

You have the right to information about the personal data concerning you (Art. 15 GDPR), a right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR), erasure (Art. 17 GDPR) and to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR), a right to object to processing (Art. 21 GDPR) and the right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR), insofar as these rights exist in each individual case in accordance with the aforementioned provisions. You can assert these rights with us at any time or you have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent data protection authority (in particular your EU domicile or the Austrian Data Protection Authority).

Data erasure and storage duration

Your personal data will be deleted or blocked as soon as the purpose of storage no longer applies. Data may also be stored if this has been provided for by the European or national legislator in EU regulations, laws or other provisions to which we are subject. The data will also be blocked or erased if a storage period prescribed by the aforementioned standards expires, unless there is a need for further storage of the data for the conclusion or fulfilment of a contract.

Legal basis

We only process your personal data to the extent necessary to provide the services and content you have requested.

Insofar as we obtain your consent for the processing of personal data, Art. 6 para. 1 lit. a EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) serves as the legal basis. If personal data is processed on the basis of your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent from us at any time with effect for the future.

If the processing of your personal data is necessary for the fulfilment of a contract to which you are a party, Art. 6 para. 1 lit. b GDPR serves as the legal basis. This also applies to processing operations that are necessary for the performance of pre-contractual measures.

Insofar as the processing of personal data is necessary to fulfil a legal obligation to which the Austrian Red Cross is subject, Art. 6 para. 1 lit. c GDPR serves as the legal basis.

In the event that vital interests of you or another natural person require the processing of personal data, Art. 6 para. 1 lit. d GDPR serves as the legal basis.

If the processing is necessary to safeguard a legitimate interest of our company or a third party and if the interests, fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject do not outweigh the former interest, Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR serves as the legal basis for the processing. If we process data on the basis of a balancing of interests, you as the data subject have the right to object to the processing of personal data, taking into account the provisions of Art. 21 GDPR.

Source of the data

When you register, we have received your data either from you or from your institution. For certain events, we use our address database to invite people who have previously expressed an interest.

Summary:

The course takes place on the training platform of the European Union Agency for Asylum (EUAA), which is why your data will be transmitted to the EUAA.

We are obliged to submit a list of participating persons to our sponsors as proof of the activity.

Purposes

Your data will be processed for registration, organisation and implementation of the course (online phase and face-to-face meeting) (contractual or pre-contractual measures).

Transmission of personal data

The course can only be held as part of a funded project and possibly together with co-organisers. We are obliged to submit a list of participants to our funding bodies (Federal Ministry of the Interior and Austrian Integration Fund) and any co-organisers as proof of the activity. This list contains: First name, surname, organisation, age group, email address, gender, country and event. We are also obliged to obtain feedback both immediately and a few months after the event and forward it to the funding bodies.

The course uses the platform of the training curriculum of the European Union Agency for Asylum (EUAA). Therefore, your data will also be transmitted to the EUAA and processed by it for the purpose of course participation.
